DO YOU WANT WHAT I HAVE GOT? A CRAIGSLIST CANTATA A TORONTO PREMIERE CO-PRODUCED BY FACTORY THEATRE & ACTING UP STAGE COMPANY

TORONTO, ON... After playing to sold-out houses and rave reviews at Vancouver's PuSh Festival in 2012, Do You Want What I Have Got? A Craigslist Cantata, by Veda Hille and Bill Richardson, will be playing January 30 - March 3 in Factory's Studio Theatre. The Toronto premiere is co-produced by Acting Up Stage Company and Factory Theatre. Do You Want What I Have Got? A Craigslist Cantata is a contemporary exploration of humanity through the lens of Craigslist - an online classified site with over 50 million ads posted each month. Previews are on January 30, 31 and February 1, 2, 3 and 5. The previews are at 8 p.m., with the exception of the Sunday, February 3 preview at 7 p.m. The industry evening is on February 6, 8 p.m., and the opening is on February 7, 8 p.m., in the Studio. The show closes on March 3.

A Craigslist Cantata*; world premiere of Theatre Replacement/PuSh Festival's 100% Vancouver; Vancouver Opera's *Lucia di Lammermoor*), the musical features a strong cast and creative team. In the cast is **Dmitry Chepovetsky** (select acting credits: Canadian Stage's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*; Vancouver Playhouse's *This*; world premiere of Arts Club/PuSh Festival's *Do You Want What I Have Got? A Craigslist Cantata*), **Bree Greig** (select acting credits: world premiere of Arts Club/PuSh Festival's *Do You Want What I Have Got? A Craigslist Cantata*; Footlight Theatre Company's *The Wizard of Oz* and *The Sound of Music*; Patrick Street Productions' *Bat Boy The Musical*), **Daren A. Herbert** (select acting credits: Acting Up Stage's *Parade*; DanCap Production's *The Toxic Avenger*), **Veda Hille** (composer, musical director and performer), **Selina Martin** (select acting credits: Arts Club/PuSh Festival's world premiere of *Do You Want What I Have Got? Veda Hille is joined on the creative team by choreographer **Monica Dottor**, set and costume designer **Robin Fisher** and lighting designer **Kimberly Purtell**, with stage management by **Dustyn Wales**.

All previews are at 8 p.m., except for the Sunday, February 3 preview at 7 p.m. Regular show times for *Craigslist* run Tuesday to Saturday, 8 p.m., plus two Saturday 2 p.m. matinee shows - February 9 and 23, and two shows on Sunday, 2:30 p.m. and 7 p.m.; preview tickets are \$22 with regular single tickets for *Craigslist* at \$35 Tuesday to Thursday and Sunday (advance), \$40 on Friday and \$47 on Saturday. Sunday Pay-What-You-Can (PWYC) tickets and savings for students, seniors, arts workers, and groups (10+) are available.

Backgrounder 1 - About Acting Up Stage Theatre Company

Acting Up Stage Company is excited to round off the 2012/2013 season with the inaugural **Banks Prize Showcase** and a brand new production of William Finn's landmark musical **Falsettos**. Created by and featuring **Alexis Gordon** and **Andres Sierra**, winners of the 2012 **Syd and Shirley Banks Prize for Emerging Artists**, the Banks Prize Showcase will be an intimate evening composed of signature songs and personal stories as they explore the obstacles of type, size, race and sound. Filled with highs and lows, laughter and tears, **Canada's Next Top Token** is a hilarious reminder of why anyone gets into this crazy career in the first place. <u>Performances are on February 18 and 25 at 8 PM in the Factory Studio Theatre</u>. From **the creative team behind last year's Dora Award winning Caroline, or Change, Falsettos** is set against the backdrop of the sexual-revolution and the emergence of AIDS. This Tony and Drama Desk Award winning musical tells the story of Marvin, a married father who – in 1979 – leaves his wife and son for another man. <u>Previews are on April 23 and 24, *Falsettos* opens on April 25 and runs through May 12 at the Daniels Spectrum (formerly Regent Park Arts & Cultural Centre).</u>

Since 2004, Acting Up Stage Company (Mitchell Marcus, Artistic Producer) has brought stellar Canadian casts to productions of contemporary and provocative musicals. The company has been heralded with rave reviews, sold-out performances, six (6) Dora Awards and six (6) Toronto Theatre Critics Awards for its productions, including the multiple Dora Award winning *Caroline, or Change,* as well as Dora nominated hits, *Parade, The Light In The Piazza, Elegies: A Song Cycle, and A New Brain*.

Backgrounder 2 - About Factory Theatre:

Now playing and upcoming shows in Factory Theatre's revitalized 2012/13 season include *Every Letter Counts, Iceland* and *Stopheart*. *Every Letter Counts,* by Nina Lee Aquino and directed by Nigel Shawn Williams, runs January 26 – February

24 in Factory's Mainspace Theatre. *Iceland*, by **Nicolas Billon** and directed by **Ravi Jain**, plays March 2 - 24 in Factory's Mainspace Theatre. Set against the backdrop of the banking crisis, a confrontation between a real estate agent and a tenant takes an unexpected turn. *Iceland* previews on March 2, 3, 5 and 6 and opens on March 7. Factory's 2012/13 season concludes with the world premiere of **Amy Lee Lavoie**'s *Stopheart*, helmed by Edmonton-based director **Ron Jenkins**, May 4 – 26. Growing up in a small town is hard. Growing up "different" in a small town in Northern Ontario town called South Porcupine is even *harder*. *Stopheart* is a heart-wrenching side-splitting dark comedy. *Stopheart* previews on May 4, 5, 7 and 8 and opens May 9. *Iceland* and *Stopheart* show times are Tuesday to Saturday, 8pm, and Sunday, 2 p.m. (Sunday preview, 7 p.m.). Preview tickets are \$22. Regular single tickets are \$32 Tuesday to Thursday and Sunday (advance), \$36 Friday and \$42 Saturday.
